Cypripedium Around the World

- Cypripedium is one of the 5 genera of "slipper orchids" – Cypripedium, Phragmipedium, Paphiopedilum, Mexipedium, and Selenipedium
- There are 45 species of Cypripedium
- Temperate, terrestrial orchids
 - 30 species in China
 - 14 species in North America and Mexico
- About 12 species are easy to cultivate
- Several Cypripedium hybrids have been developed that have excellent garden potential

Propagating Cypripediums


- Cypripedium has been difficult to propagate from seed – first reported in 1986
- Several species have still not been propagated from mature seed
- More than 100 primary hybrids have been flowered
- About a dozen complex hybrids have been flowered

Center: Seed following one cycle of vaccum (note lightening of pigment).
Right: Seed following three cycles of vacuum (note the lighter pigment as bleaching progresses).
